

“Jailbreak Definition & Conversations”
“Parent Information & Awareness”

The original definition of “*jailbreak*” was to unlock an Apple device. Apple keeps their IOS secure and this makes it extremely difficult to break into an Apple device(s). Currently, use of the term “jailbreak” is to identify the electronic device they want to unlock or to override controls placed on a system that is owned by a company, school, or government entity. Any electronic device can be “jailbroke” including PCs, Chromebooks, Apple devices, Android devices, and even Firesticks.

If a jailbreak occurs on a managed DT26J Chromebook, this will remove all the barriers, as required by School Policies and Procedures and the Children’s Internet Protection Act (CIPA). As a school district, we want to support you as parents in keeping all students from exposure to dangerous material and potentially infecting the Deer Trail School network infrastructure with malware, viruses, identity theft and tracking software.

Once a Chromebook has been jailbroke the user can go anywhere on the Internet. The limitations put in place to comply with CIPA (district filters) are eliminated. Also, when a Chromebook has been jailbroke, the device can be permanently damaged or require tech personnel to put the factory loaded software back onto the device. The device will not work on the school network. The device is also flagged by Google and Go-Guardian. Our tech personnel see where the user has been on the Internet and the usage history of the device. Finally, the jailbreak process can turn the device into an inoperable “useless brick”.

Starting this year, Middle and High School students will be assigned a Chromebook. Students will be responsible for maintaining the physical condition of the device as well as the operating system that is managed by DT26J. Please review the *Computer/Internet Device Custody & Use Agreement* that all parents and students **must sign, prior to being issued a Chromebook**. Like any parent, DT26J technology and teaching staff remains vigilant in providing a safe, responsible physical learning environment as well as ensuring online access for students is safe and secure through district owned devices.

COMPUTER/INTERNET DEVICE CUSTODY AND USE AGREEMENT

This form must be completed before equipment is issued to a student.

Any District-owned equipment removed from school is subject to and must comply with **Board Policy JS & JS-E**. By signing below, you agree that:

1. You are personally responsible for the equipment listed above. If the equipment is damaged, lost or stolen, you are responsible for the reasonable cost of repair or replacement, as determined by the District, on the date of damage or loss. Damage, loss or theft of the equipment must be immediately reported to the District.
2. The District may remotely monitor, update and disable equipment to protect the District's network, systems, the device and/or data on the device.
3. Legal title to the equipment will at all times remain with the District.
4. The District may revoke this agreement at any time for any reason. Upon notice of revocation of the agreement you shall promptly return the equipment to the District.
5. The equipment must be returned to the District by the return date indicated above. Failure to return the equipment to the District by that date will result in the District charging you the full replacement cost of any equipment not returned. Returned equipment is expected to be in good working order and the same condition as when it was issued, taking into consideration normal usage.
6. THE DISTRICT MAKES NO WARRANTIES OF ANY KIND, EXPRESS OR IMPLIED, REGARDING THE EQUIPMENT PROVIDED. UNDER NO CIRCUMSTANCES IS THE DISTRICT RESPONSIBLE TO YOU OR ANY THIRD PARTIES FOR ANY DIRECT, INDIRECT OR CONSEQUENTIAL DAMAGES, LOSSES, OR COSTS CAUSED BY OR ARISING FROM ANY USE OF THE EQUIPMENT, INCLUDING ANY LOSS OF DATA.
7. To the maximum extent permitted by law, you shall indemnify the District against any claim, cause of action, judgment, loss, demand, suit, or legal proceeding brought against the District or its officers, employees, representatives, or agents, which arises directly or indirectly from your use of the equipment.
8. **Should you "Jail Break, Disable, Modify, Corrupt" etc.... the operating system of a Chromebook or any other DT26J computer or device that you are have used in any manner, you will be subject to the DT26J Discipline Matrix & applicable school policies.**
